

Conditions of entry

Welcome to the Blue Mountains Cultural Centre.

For the safety of visitors, staff as well as works of art, you must observe our conditions of entry and follow any directions from staff.

- This facility is regulated by the provisions of the Inclosed Land Protection Act 1901

It is a requirement that you:

- Conduct yourself responsibly and be respectful to others. The Blue Mountains Cultural Centre does not tolerate any abuse directed towards staff, volunteers, contractors or other visitors, and will not tolerate behaviour that is discriminatory, offensive or abusive.
- Keep noise to a level that does not disturb other people and, in exhibition spaces, switch mobile phones to silent
- Have a valid ticket or pass to enter ticketed exhibitions or events at the Cultural Centre and will abide by the ticket terms and these terms of entry.
- If directed by staff or volunteers, cloak bags or backpacks with Reception before visiting the Gallery space or Shop.
- Comply with any directions from staff, including but not limited to directions to leave the premises at closing time and for any other reason (including exhibiting symptoms of illness), directions in the event of emergency, directions to move away from objects and exhibits, and directions to observe barriers and signage.
- Ensure that children under the age of 10 are accompanied by a responsible adult and are actively supervised at all times.
- Report any injury sustained on site to a Blue Mountains Cultural Centre staff member

It is a requirement that you do not:

- Touch or interfere with works of art in any way, unless instructions clearly indicate interaction is encouraged.
- Damage any Blue Mountains Cultural Centre property
- Bring or consume your own alcohol, enter under the influence of alcohol or drugs, or consume or carry illegal drugs.
- Smoke or vape on premises including the Viewing Platform.
- Distribute political material or conduct solicitation, leafleting, signature gathering or canvassing within Blue Mountains Cultural Centre.
- Consume food or drink in Gallery or exhibitions spaces.

- Participate in the theft of any items from the premises. The Blue Mountains Cultural Centre uses CCTV and reserves the right to use footage collected in accordance with NSW Police.

Blue Mountains Cultural Centre reserves the right to remove any individuals who refuse to comply with these Conditions of Entry. A ban of up to 12 months may be issued if these conditions of entry are breached.
